

# How the instrumental subsidy program works

The college is pleased to offer students in Years 3 to 5 the chance to be part of Tatachilla's two-year instrumental subsidy program – a fantastic opportunity for children to discover the joy of learning a musical instrument while benefiting from significant savings on tuition fees.

This program is open to new beginners on:

- string instruments violin, viola, cello
- wind instruments trumpet, trombone, flute, clarinet, saxophone

## **Getting started**

Families who would like their child to start learning an instrument as part of the subsidy program are invited to lodge an <u>instrumental subsidy program nomination form</u>.

Lessons typically commence in **Term 1** of the academic year, following the college's **testing**, **selection** and **instrument allocation process**.

Mid-year applications may also be considered.

The program is ideal for students who are ready and eager to take on the commitment of regular practice and lessons.

Most children in Years 3 to 5 already have the musical foundations needed to benefit significantly from the program.

Our music staff then look for enthusiasm, commitment and the readiness to practise consistently.

This is assessed through:

- an instrument tryout
- a short questionnaire
- discussion with the student and their teachers and caregivers.

Parental encouragement is essential in helping children develop good practice habits.

## **Choosing the right instrument**

Some instruments suit certain physical and personality traits better than others.

The college's assessment process helps the music team match each child with the instrument that they are most compatible and that they are likely to have the most success with as a musician.

This means that some students may not receive their first choice of instrument.



## **Program commitment**

Upon acceptance to the program, students commit to **two years** of lessons and ensemble participation.

#### This involves:

- a weekly group instrumental lesson
- a weekly rehearsal in either the concert band, chapel band or string ensemble
- instrumental practise at home 3 to 5 times a week

#### **Cost to families**

The cost to families is \$500 per year (total \$1,000 over two years).

This annual levy is charged to caregivers' school fee account.

## Available instruments by year level:

The following instruments are available:

- Year 3: violin, viola, cello
- Year 4: violin, viola, cello, trumpet, trombone, flute, clarinet, saxophone
- Year 5: trumpet, trombone, flute, clarinet, saxophone.
