A uniform for all seasons

Tatachilla Lutheran College has a trans-seasonal uniform that is designed to be practical, comfortable and contemporary.

This approach allows students to:

- mix and match interchangeable items to suit personal preferences and seasonal conditions
- layer clothing for comfort during both indoor and outdoor activities
- participate fully in all aspects of the school week with ease.

Our uniform does not have mandated summer or winter options. Instead, it comprises a flexible wardrobe of both compulsory and optional items for all-year-round wear.

The college has a separate sport uniform for the days that students are timetabled to participate in Health and Physical Education classes and other sporting events, like sports days and cross-country runs.

Students in the junior years (Reception – Year 6) wear a different uniform to students in the middle and senior years (Years 7 – 12).

The Tatachilla cross unifies our entire uniform range, symbolising the college's strong faith culture.

Wearing the college uniform encourages a strong sense of pride, equality and belonging across our student community.

All students are expected to uphold our uniform guidelines as part of their enrolment and their commitment to school life.



Formal black leather lace-up shoes



Student appearance

The college expects all students to maintain a neat and well-groomed appearance that reflects pride in their school community.

As such, the following guidelines are in place:

- Make-up: Students in Reception to Year 9 are not permitted to wear make-up. Students in Year 10 to Year 12 may wear light, natural-looking make-up if desired.
- Nails: Nail polish, false nails and false eyelashes are not permitted.
- **Jewellery:** Only a plain, light chain may be worn around the neck (with or without small cross). No rings are permitted.
- Tattoos: Visible tattoos are not permitted.
- **Piercings:** One simple stud or sleeper is permitted in the lower part of each ear lobe. No other visible piercings are allowed.
- > Students in Years 7 to Year 12 with additional piercings may wear a discreet clear spacer only.
- > For health and safety reasons, students may at times be asked to remove all piercings.
- Hairstyles: Students should present with neat, clean and tidy hair, as determined by the college.
- > Hairstyles should not be extreme or designed to draw attention to the student.
- > Hair colour should not to be changed so that it is noticeably different from a natural hair colour.
- > Hair must never hang over the eyes and should be secured off the face without constant adjustment.
- > Students in the junior years (Reception to Year 6) with shoulder-length hair must have all hair tied back completely (hair is considered to be shoulder-length when it falls below the lowest part of the collar).

- Students are to remain clean-shaven.
- Short all-over haircuts must be no shorter than a "number two" cut
- For health and safety reasons, students may at times be asked to tie long hair back (for example, in Science, Physical Education or Technology classes).
- Any students who are considering changing their hairstyle or hair colour – and are doubtful as to how this would be received by the college – should first seek approval from the appropriate teacher (Reception to Year 6) or Flourish Leader (Year 7 to Year 12).
- Hair accessories: Hair garments are limited to those sold at the uniform shop as well as ribbons, hair ties and claw clips that are white, black, grey or red in colour.



Casual clothes days

From time to time, students may be invited to wear casual clothes for events such as fundraising days, excursions, camps and college celebrations.

On these occasions, we ask students to:

Wear sun-safe, comfortable and school-appropriate clothing Choose clothing that does not conflict with the values of our college community

Wear enclosed footwear for safety at all times

Avoid singlets and crop tops
