Matthew's skills shine at regional competition



Congratulations to our Year 11 student **Matthew** on his stellar performance at a state final of the South Australian WorldSkills Australia Regional Competition.

Known as the Tradie Olympics, every two years, more than 500 WorldSkills Competitions take place in 34 regions across Australia. These one-day events test the skills and knowledge of the 4,000-plus apprentices, trainees and students who compete for the chance to win a regional gold, silver or bronze medal and a place in the national final.

Through his Certificate II in Electrotechnology, Matthew competed in a WorldSkills South Australian heat for the group training organisation PEER that saw him progress to the state final. At the final, Matthew faced off against 18 other competitors, putting his electrical skills to the test. Matthew showcased his abilities in a series of high-stakes timed tests on safety planning, electrical installation, soldering and circuit testing, before completing a theory exam.

Matthew performed strongly across the day and was the only participant to finish the soldering task. The South Australian results are pending and will be announced once other training providers complete their WorldSkills heats and finals. In the meantime, we congratulate Matthew on his exceptional performance and are keeping our fingers crossed that he is selected for a place at the Australian Worldskills National final in 2027. Go Matthew!

Tatachilla students learn the lessons from history to succeed



Our Year 9 and Year 10 students have excelled at the 2026 Australian History Competition. Both cohorts outperformed the national average, with our Year 10 results head and shoulders above other schools.

The Australian History Competition challenges students to analyse a diverse range of historical sources and apply their knowledge in unfamiliar contexts. Our students' results demonstrate why we place historical knowledge, critical thinking, source analysis and reasoning skills at the heart of studying history at Tatachilla.

Our students achieved perfect scores in key sections of the test and impressive results in the higher-order skills of inference and analysis. These results are a testament to their willingness to challenge themselves and extend their historical thinking beyond the classroom.

In addition to a strong performance by all our Year 9 and Year 10 students, several of our budding historians achieved outstanding individual successes at the competition. In Year 10, **Archie** and **Brennan** received distinctions, **Max** was awarded a merit and **Nicholas** received a credit. In Year 9, **Noah** was awarded a credit.

Well done to all our students for being excellent ambassadors for our college and the Tatachilla community. Congratulations on your achievements. We're so proud of you.

Junior years students full of beans for National Science Week



This year, National Science Week's Grow a Great Bean Challenge sowed the idea among teachers and students to try plant cultivation for themselves. The hands-on activity let students experiment with seed germination and plant growth in the classroom.

Each class from Reception to Year 6 received three bean seeds, soil, and cups, and the challenge to work out how to give their beans the best chance to thrive. Together, each classroom of students decided where to position their plants and how to care for them, observing and recording changes as the seeds germinated and grew.

There was plenty of experimentation along the way. The young scientists placed their plants in different locations around classrooms. One Year 2 class even managed to grow a bean in a cupboard! The excitement as the first shoots appeared and plants began to grow was wonderful to see.

A team of Year 5 students played an important role, serving as plant monitors and judges for the challenge. They visited each Reception to Year 6 classroom to monitor progress. At the end of the challenge, our Year 5 team inspected the final plants and selected a winning bean from each year level.

Thank you to our junior years students and teachers for embracing Science Week with such gusto.

Congratulations to Year 11 student **Tom**, who recently competed at the Short Course Swimming State Championships. Across eight races over three days, Tom achieved a personal best in every event, along with an outstanding six gold medals and five state multiclass records.
